

Beech Bottom Campsite

Just to the east of the Mile 9 marker the trail runs alongside a stream and makes a slight turn uphill (east) and the campsite location sign is on the north side (left) of the trail. This well used site is moved (relocated) from east to west side (and back) of the water every couple years to keep compaction down. **Be aware the old locations are not to be used** (there are signs noting which is the current authorized site and old site area closed). There is 12' bridge over the water on the path leading off the PMT to the current site on west side of the creek. If you leave Molly Hugger Hill Parking Lot and go west on the trail, you have about a two mile hike in. You go down and up several times with some pretty good switch-backs west of Mile 10. The site is a flat cleared area under tree cover. Be aware of the signs at the back (north side) of the site that mark the boundary of FDR State Park, the pines there are private property. There are **two** established fire rings at the camp. The water source for the site can be counted on all year long.
